

WHAT TO PUT IN THE FARM FIRST AID BOX



Most first aid products for livestock will be in larger size bottles. Starting with a plastic tote box from the beginning will help you keep all the medical supplies handy and organized. Using multiple smaller boxes inside the large box will keep things even more organized, and clean. Keeping ointments and smaller bottles in a smaller box will help you find them quickly, too.



Scissors, tweezers, various sizes of syringes, rectal thermometer with string attached, large bath towel, notebook, and pen to record treatments



Saline solution, bottled water, iodine or Betadine solution, hydrogen peroxide, Vaseline, or Waxlene for lubricant



Antibacterial wound spray, antibacterial wound ointment, Blu-kote spray, electrolytes, Nutradrench, Vitamin products, herbal treatments



Gauze pads, gauze wrap, vet wrap, (cohesive bandage), cotton balls, cotton tipped swabs, adhesive tape, electrical tape, paper towels



Syringes, needles, injected medications, (iron, penicillin, prescription meds, used under veterinary direction)

Keeping the first aid supplies stocked at all times, helps you keep your cool in an emergency



Have appropriately sized transport crates available in case the animal needs immediate veterinary help.



Keep halters, collars, lead lines, leashes in the same spot and return them after use, so they are easy to find in case of emergency
